INSTRUCTIONS

The NWCG Course Skill Assessment is designed to provide feedback from an instructor to a participant during the delivery of a course. The NWCG Course Skill Assessment is a mechanism to determine how well a task was performed or not performed during a course activity. Evaluation of performance is based on rating variations of "no opportunity, does not meet standards, meets standards, exceeds standards as appropriate." There is also room for written narrative to accompany the skill assessment.

The NWCG Course Skill Assessment has two components: **Assessment Signature Page** and **Skill Assessment** rating page for each activity.

SIGNATURE PAGE:

This page validates the student successfully completed all activities outlined in the skill assessment.

The Initiation block is filled out by a course instructor.

The Verification block is completed by a course instructor once the participant:

- 1. Completed all activity tasks.
- 2. Successfully met or exceeded satisfactory performance of all critical activity tasks in the skill assessments.
- 3. Is recommended by the lead instructor for successful completion of the course.

Once signed by the lead instructor, the skill assessment will be returned to the student and a copy retained by the course coordinator/lead instructor, meeting *NWCG Standards for Course Delivery*, PMS 901-1.

Activity Rating:

The NWCG Course Skill Assessment is used to record the evaluation that a participant receives for a single course session. A new Skill Assessment page is used for each course activity.

Start the Skill Assessment activity page by completing the information on the top of the form.

The Skill Assessment is a list of tasks, per training course activity, required for successful performance in the course. Participants must be observed completing all tasks and show knowledge and competency in their performance during the classroom activities. The evaluator will rate the performance of the tasks as follows:

Rating	Description
N/O	No opportunity to perform the duty and responsibility for this activity.
D	Does not meet the standard for duty and responsibility as described in <i>NWCG Incident Position Standards for Crew Boss, Single Resource</i> , PMS 350-98. Evaluators should provide written feedback when the trainee does not meet standards.
M	Meets the standard for duty and responsibility as described in <i>NWCG Incident Position Standards for Crew Boss, Single Resource</i> , PMS 350-98.
Е	Exceeds the standard for duty and responsibility as described in <i>NWCG Incident Position Standards for Crew Boss, Single Resource</i> , PMS 350-98.

Activity tasks with an asterisk (*) in the left column signify a "Critical" activity task, and the student must achieve at least an "M-Meets the standard rating" to successfully complete the course. As a coach or instructor when determining a rating, consider the following:

Rating	Criteria
N/A	If the task was not applicable to the activity, work with the participant to demonstrate the activity task another way.
N/O	If the task was not initially observed, work with the participant to demonstrate the activity task another way.
D	The participant demonstrated lack of knowledge and/or ability to complete the activity task. Work with the participant to remediate and demonstrate the ability to meet the standard.
M	The participant demonstrates a baseline knowledge and/or ability to complete the activity task.
Е	The student would be able to teach other classmates, without instructor intervention, allowing other classmates to meet the standards of the activity task.

If a participant receives a rating of D or N/O, instructor remediation will be provided. If remediation is necessary, a coach or instructor should find an opportunity to discuss the task, and work with the participant to further develop knowledge and understanding. Provide the participant with another opportunity to demonstrate knowledge and/or ability to complete the task. Re-evaluate the task by completing another skill assessment sheet with updated results.

If the instructor uses a rating of D as a final task evaluation, there must be a narrative in the Comment section explaining why the rating was used.

At the conclusion of the course activities, the instructor and participant should discuss the skill assessment, and go over the ratings and instructor recommendations.

Participant Who Does Not Successfully Complete the Skill Assessment

After completion of activities, coaching, and remediation, if a participant is deemed unsuccessful in completing the tasks outlined as "Critical" in the skill assessment, the instructor will recommend the participant review content, the position standards, and register to take the course again at a later date.
